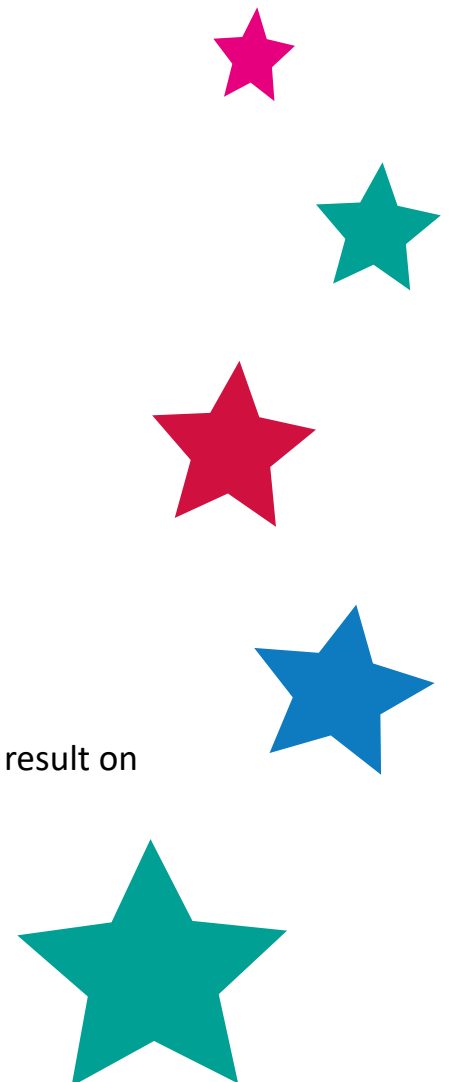

On Tuesday 30th April we had one hundred and twenty students from Years 7 and 8 take part in the UK Junior Maths Challenge.

Of the students who took part we had twenty eight students receive a bronze certificate, nine students receive a silver certificate, and five students receive a gold certificate.

Further to this we had two students progress to the next round. Chloe Palmer, from Year 7, who took part in the Olympiad Challenge, and Aron Mazey, from Year 8, who took part in the Kangaroo Challenge. These students took part in the second round of the challenge on Tuesday 11th June 2019. Chloe achieved a Merit in the second round while Aron achieved a Qualification.

Kuk Sool Won

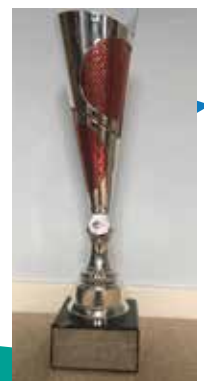

The Year 8 athletics team competed in the Super8 athletics competition in Bury St Edmunds earlier this term, with each student participating in a track event, a field event and the medley relay.



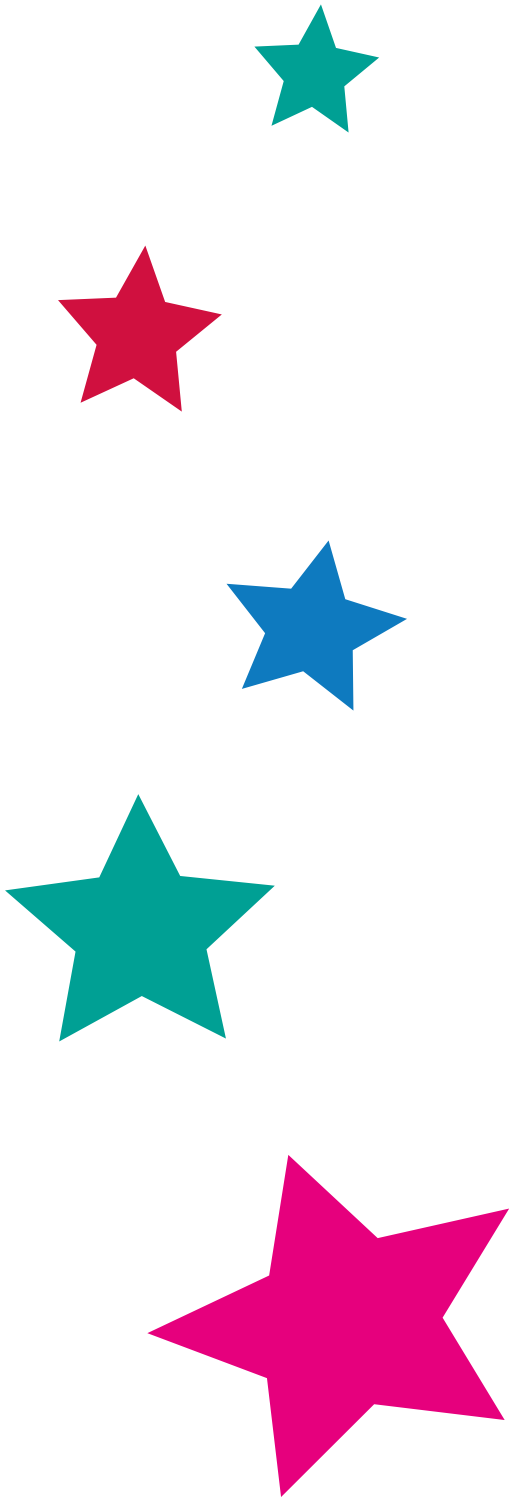
