



Sporting Success

The under 12s' rounders team started off with their first ever league fixture on 8th June 2017. After a shaky and nervous start in their first game, the girls went on and won the second game and from there have not looked back.

On 13th June the girls went to Ormiston Sudbury Academy for the West Suffolk Rounders Tournament where they competed against various schools from the Bury/Sudbury area of Suffolk. The first opponents were the host school, Ormiston. The girls won this game seven rounders to five. Second opponents were Stowupland High School. The girls came into form and performed to a very high standard beating Stowupland twelve rounders to two.

Last game in the group stages came against King Edwards School. The girls managed to hold their nerve and won five and a half to four and a half rounders. This took them through as group winners. On to the semi-finals where they were able to show how good their rounders ability was by beating Horringer in the Semi-Final; nine to three and a half. The girls then went into the final playing Westley School. Superb hitting and precision fielding gave the girls an emphatic win – eight rounders to three and a half rounders. The girls won the West Suffolk Rounders and qualified for the finals a couple of days later back in Sudbury.

Fourth and final opponent of the day was Westley. Again, the girls showed how well they worked as a team and with their excellent batting ability beating Westley seven and a half to three and a half.

At the end of the tournament the team waited nervously to find out the result. MCA came runners-up out of the whole County, narrowly missing out to Ipswich High School for Girls by that half a rounder!

The girls played exceptionally well across all games, showed great team work and commitment and should be very proud of their achievement!
